Bees & Pollinators

Sunday, May 22 9:00am – 12:00pm

Spend time in the outdoor gardens looking at and learning about invertebrate pollinators that help your garden flourish! This class offers an introduction to creating and maintaining your own pollinator habitats, as well as a primer on the identification and behavior of some of the Front Range's most important pollinators.
